SUBJECT: FY 2010 Final Base Award Levels

As a result of the Consolidated Appropriations Act for 2010, signed December 16, 2009, **\$54,798,000** was made available to support Consultation 21(d) cooperative agreements. This represents an increase of \$267,000 over the FY 2009 funding level which is being distributed using the approved consultation funding formula. In addition, \$60,000 in unmatched FY 2009 funding from Northern Mariana Islands and Ohio is being redistributed. Your final base award for your FY 2010 21(d) cooperative agreement, based on your ability to match, is reflected in the attached spreadsheet.

In FY 2009, there were unmatched funds of \$146,000 reserved to support consultation initiatives that will benefit all projects. These funds will remain the same for FY 2010 and will be distributed as one-time only funds.

It is imperative that you notify the Regional Administrator as soon as possible, but no later than February 10, 2010, of your ability to match any of the additional Federal funds being made available to you this year. Regional Administrators (RA) should share such information with the Division of Grants Management via e-mail to Oborski.Pavlo@dol.gov. If State-wide alternative or reduced work schedules affect the funding available for State salaries and the State's ability to match, this should be reflected in the RA notification and the cooperative agreement amendment.

Each project needs to execute the appropriate cooperative agreement amendment in order to complete its final FY 2010 cooperative agreement award by submitting the amendment electronically in Grants.gov. The cooperative agreement amendment package will include the following documents:

Review of amendments should be coordinated with your Regional Administrator so amendments can be submitted electronically in Grants.gov on or before February 22, 2010. The Funding Opportunity Number is **OSHA-21D-2010-002**.

Regions must submit a memorandum to the Directors of Administrative Programs and Cooperative and State Programs for each amendment, reflecting recommendations for approval or disapproval of the grant amendment as submitted in Grants.gov by March 1, 2010. As soon as your amendment has been reviewed and approved, the Department of Health and Human Services - Payment Management System will be updated to reflect the revised award level.
