<b>Project Summary/Overview</b>	To develop educational programs and materials for the Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Project for understanding the Underground Railroad Network to Freedom as part of the American National History, specifically for K-12 educators and to further expand the mission using Common Core Literacy standards. The mission includes coordinating preservation and education efforts nationwide and integrating local historical places, museums, and interpretive programs associated with the Underground Railroad into a mosaic of community, regional, and national stories.
<b>Recipient Involvement</b>	The National Council for History Education will collaborate with the NPS to produce materials consistent with current educational Common Core in Literacy standards for teaching about the Underground Railroad.
