

The Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Cooperative Weed Management Areas Request for Applications Webinar

In 2010, the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative (GLRI) was launched to protect and restore the Great Lakes. Two of the main goals of GLRI are managing invasive species and restoring habitat to protect native species. To help accomplish these goals, the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) is accepting applications from Cooperative Weed Management Areas (CWMAs) and other similar organizations for invasive plant management projects in the Great Lakes Basin.

To clarify the process and facilitate applications, the USFS will host a webinar to discuss various aspects of the GLRI CWMA request for applications. We will provide background information on the program, discuss eligibility and how it is determined, and will discuss how to apply for funding using the Grants.gov system. Keep “Enter as a Guest” selected, type your name in the “name” box, and click “Enter Room.” Although it is best to connect from a computer with a hard-wired connection (not wireless), you can join from certain mobile devices with the free Adobe Connect Mobile app (for iPad or iPhone, download the [iTunes App](#); for Android devices, download the [Android App](#)).

3. AUDIO

To connect through telephone, mute your computer speakers and call **1-888-844-9904** and use participant code **8991475#**. Phone audio will allow you to both listen and speak up with questions. To listen through your computer, make sure your computer speakers are on and listen with speakers or headphones. If you listen through the computer, you will not be able to speak up with questions, but will be able to type questions into the chat pod.
